#### 'GOOD NEWS' FROM AROUND THE CIRCUIT

Dear All.

This Sunday, 15 September, the focus of our Circuit Prayers is on Weedon, and Sarah shares her response to the challenge to discover and



use the gifts that God has given her for sharing the love of Christ with those around her. Some of our gifts are not immediately obvious and it did take Sarah a while to find out what hers were. We may need to spend time searching for our gifts, but be assured God has blessed each one of us and He has us lined up for mighty things! Pete.

I didn't have a relationship with God when I was growing up. Coming from a non-religious family, it was never on the agenda to go to church — even on high days and holidays — and the nearest I got was at an annual pantomime performed in the local church hall. I guess when you're young, it is natural just to push on - if you have the opportunities - and try to make a life for yourself that involves a level of self-sufficiency whilst being supported by family and friends. Certainly when you are very young, everything revolves around you and your emotions and there is a sense of Immediacy about how and when things happen. And so, my young adult life was all about making friends, travelling and pursuing a career in law. I was happy living it up at events: my boyfriend's army dinners; my university balls; Law Society presentations and City law firm away-days. Those times now seem long ago, but I think back then it was all about the here and now - I was also a good talker and not much of a listener.

God has given me one precious gift, one that I make use of every single day and that is to listen. Hearing what others have to say is, to me, one of the most important qualities. You might argue that this is just the wisdom that comes with experience and age, but for me this is what God wants me to do. I like to listen to someone's point of view. It doesn't matter whether I agree with it or not - each one of us is entitled to express themselves and their feelings - but to understand that point of view is important. It is God's wish that I can empathise with many different folk from many different walks of life. Being able to see things from another person's perspective is something

that gives me so much joy – it is enlightening, eye-opening and mind-bending at times, and boring at others, which can be challenging but always thought provoking. I truly believe that, through this ability God has given me to listen to others, I can be a better person and hopefully be of help to some along the way, and I pray that God's calling me in this manner is not just for the here and now, but something that will endure for the rest of my life.

For peace of mind, eavesdropping is not included – my hearing is not quite good enough!
